## A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR SMALL

Greetings in the name of Jesus Christ, and welcome to our first newsletter in recent history!

I do thank God for each of you and continue to ask your prayers for Calvary Lutheran, for our shared ministry, for myself and for my family. I have said it before, and I'll say it again, prayer is our weapon, our battle cry of faith, and it is effective. The first thing we should do in the morning is pray; the last thing we should do at night is pray, and in between? Pray. Which leads me to the Bible verses I pray guide my ministry among you and for you and in our community:

The first is Romans 12:12 "Rejoice in hope, be patient in tribulation, be constant in prayer." We rejoice in the sure hope of the forgiveness of sins and the resurrection of our Lord, prefiguring our own victories over death. We are patient in the troubles, stresses, anxieties, and tribulations of this age, because Christ has inaugurated a new era of hope. And we are in prayer, as God the Holy Spirit speaks faith and that same confident hope in our hearts, that we are changed and made holy in our living and our actions.

The second verse I pray is a theme for my ministry is from John 3:30 "He must increase, but I must decrease." It isn't about me or my pride. It is about Jesus. What we do in our lives, in ministry, together as a congregation, individually as Christians, point to Jesus and to our faith, the faith given to us in baptism, the faith which brings salvation because Jesus completed his work on the cross and in his resurrection.

There are many other verses that would be appropriate verses for our ministry together, but I will start with those, and with our quarterly memory verse: Galatians 6:9 "And let us not grow weary of doing good, for in due season we will reap, if we do not give up." The Holy Spirit is at work in you, in your midst, and around you. We persevere in joyful hope, together, with God's graces and blessings.



Welcome to the inaugural edition of Calvary's first newsletter! On behalf of our church council, I'd like to provide you with updates on certain topics of importance to our church.


On a positive note, we are completing our final refurbishment work repairing and upgrading our lower-level Fellowship Hall, following the April 2024 flood. This Hall will now afford us with a beautiful (essentially new) space for fellowship. In addition, I'm happy to report that our church website was recently updated and upgraded, with new, expanded information. Take a look at the new, more current format. Also, on behalf of Council I want to thank everyone who has donated their time, talent and treasure over the past year to help us upgrade and improve our church facilities. Of particular note was the very successful, generous contributions in response to our facility fund drive, which provided for new railings, doors, bathroom fixtures, etc. Building on this success, Council has prepared a list of additional facility upgrades that will further improve the churches appearance, upkeep and functionality. Council will continue to explore options for funding of these improvements on a priority basis.

Notwithstanding the above, I need to convey to you that our church is presently facing an operating budget challenge. While our 2024 budget finished in positive territory, year-to-date in 2025, we are facing challenges to meeting our operating budget needs. Council will continue to seek ways to reverse this projected trend, and with everyone's help, I feel confident this can be turned around by year's end.

Council was recently informed that our insurance company does not intend to renew our current church policy, so we are diligently seeking other companies, with a new contract required by 9/1/25. I am confident that through the efforts of Carol Dennis and others, a new policy will be written for us by then.

There are many additional positive happenings at Calvary not mentioned above, which makes me proud to serve in my capacity for the church. With everyone's help I know we can continue to meet our challenges and be a positive force in our community.



## A NOTE FROM STEWARDSHIP

Our church is preparing (ready for this) A Talent Show! Yes, we need you and all members of Calvary to participate.



So what does a talent show have to do with stewardship? Everything! You see, good stewardship is much more than giving money to our beloved church: it's giving of yourself, your abilities, your skills, your work experience, your hobbies, your interests and your friendships in and out of church.

Let me give a few possible examples of how you can turn your talent and abilities into good stewardship.

- Let's say you have an interest in cooking or baking: now let's say a special occasion or activity is taking place at church and snacks are needed, could you be called upon to help?
- Let's say some wall in the church building needs painting: could you offer to come and paint?
- Let's say you have medical training (nurse, EMT, doctor, etc) would you be willing to participate in a parish nursing program? How? Let's say as an example, a church member is recovering from a medical procedure and needs assistance in getting back into Sunday worship. With your experience could you help?
- Let's say you are mostly house bound, could you make a few phone calls to others who are part of our shut-ins list, or call a few members to remind them of an up-coming voters meeting? In other words, you can help Calvary without leaving your home. Think of it as a phone ministry.
- Let's say you enjoy gardening, would you be able to come over and help tend our church's flower beds? Could it be that some visitors coming to Calvary do actually "judge a book by its cover?"
- Let's say you want to use or improve your riding lawnmower skills or just learn from the pros: we have lots of lawns to practice on. By the way, men and women are welcome to participate.
- Let's say you're a home handy person: there are always jobs waiting to be done in our building. Neglected small jobs often turn into big expensive repairs.
- Let's say you have a friend or neighbor that would want to help; feel free to invite them to help. Calvary is a friendly place: let's show-'em who we are.

Stewardship service possibilities are endless!

So, does Jesus talk about a talent show in the Bible? Check out Matthew 25:14-30. We need your help, your participation, your talent. Christ will show you in abundance.


